
Outstanding!

Oasis Horizons Project

The Oasis Horizons project gives every new and current pupil at BRIGHTstowe an iPad to use during their time at school. This project has come at a time when young people need digital literacy more than ever to help them succeed in work and life, as well as supporting us all with home and online learning during the global pandemic.

The fact that each pupil and staff member has the same device means that there is equal access for all, and learning together - at home and at school - is easier than ever. We also provide dongles for families who do not have access to the internet, so that connectivity is never an issue, and no child is left behind.

We are a pilot school for the Trust, which means we are at the forefront of the project, and we are proud that during our recent bubble isolation's we were able to provide a continuity of education for all our pupils through live lessons and assignments in Microsoft Teams.

These devices and this way of working is still new for all of us, and as we go into next term we will be providing an ongoing programme of training for pupils on using their iPad's effectively, and how to stay safe online through e-safety advice and the Safer Schools app on each iPad.





We are excited that blended learning will become a bigger part of our curriculum; iPads will be integrated into our classroom teaching more and more, and all home learning for pupils will move to their Microsoft Teams class from January. It will be important that pupils bring their iPad to school every day, fully charged and protected in a bag, so that they can take part in all our lessons successfully.

Oasis Horizons puts a world of knowledge, discovery and responsibility into the hands of every pupil. As they become more proficient in using the iPads, we hope our pupils will become as confident in their digital literacy as they are in their subject knowledge and skills. The independence and empowerment that comes from blended and online learning will ensure our pupils feel prepared and ready for their next steps in life, and that they leave us ready to 'shine bright' in their next stage of life.

<u>Library Update</u>





What's been going on in the Classroom?

In this term's library lessons, Year 7 have been continuing their introduction to the library by looking closely at different fiction genres and even speed-dating with fiction books!

In year 8, we've looked at events that inspired Herman Melville's 'Moby Dick' and we studied the Salem Witch Trials of 1692 and their depiction in Arthur Milller's 'The Crucible'. Some fantastic class discussions were had about different examples of McCarthyism in history and the reasons behind modern-day witch hunts.

We are delighted that all students have been issued an iPad! Our Accelerated Reader Programme for Year 7 and 8 students is due to start in the New Year and now all students will be able to quiz on their books as soon as they have read them!
